- Infections may be passed to other smokers by sharing a hookah.
- The charcoal used to heat the tobacco can raise health risks by producing high levels of carbon monoxide, metals, and cancer-causing chemicals



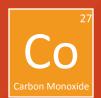


88% of students at UVA have not smoked tobacco using a water-pipe/hookah in the past 30 days.⁵

Hookah users may inhale as much smoke during one hookah session as a cigarette smoker would inhale consuming 100 or more cigarettes.¹



A recent University of Florida study shows that patrons leaving hookah cafes had carbon monoxide levels more than 3 times higher than patrons exiting bars where cigarette smoking is prohibited.²



It puts non-users, workers and patrons alike, involuntarily at risk for the same types of diseases as second-hand smoke from cigarettes, including cancer, heart disease, and respiratory illnesses.³



"Tar free" or "0% tar" tobacco does not eliminate tar from hookah smoke because tar is produced during combustion.⁴

Toxin Content of Smoke*

A single hookah session compared to smoking a single cigarette

Chemical	Hookah	Cigarette	Comparison
Tar	802.0mg	22.3mg	36x
Nicotine	2.96mg	1.74mg	1.7x
Carbon Monoxide	145.0mg	17.3mg	8.4x

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
